Bible Passage: ACTS 13:1-14:28


Memory Verse: Luke 24:46-47 NLT

#### **ENJOY THIS WEEK'S STORY!**

While the leaders of the church in Antioch (also called Syrian Antioch) worshiped and fasted, the Holy Spirit told them to set aside Saul—also called Paul—and Barnabas because they were called to be missionaries. The church leaders fasted, prayed, and sent Paul and Barnabas out to tell others the good news of Jesus.

Paul and Barnabas traveled to the island

of Cyprus and began to proclaim the gospel in the Jewish synagogues. John Mark was also with them



assisting them. Then, they traveled to the city of

Perga. At this time, John Mark left and returned to Jerusalem instead of finishing the trip. Paul and Barnabas continued to the city of Pisidian Antioch.

On the Sabbath, Paul and Barnabas went to the synagogue. The leaders of the synagogue invited Paul and Barnabas to speak any word of encouragement they had to the people. Paul stood up and said, "Fellow Israelites who fear God, listen." Paul then reminded the people of their history from Egypt to King David, a man after God's own heart. God promised that from David's family, God would send the Savior, Jesus.

Paul continued by explaining that Jesus had been put to death, but God raised Him from the dead. Then, Jesus appeared for many days to His followers, who are now His witnesses. Paul explained that the prophecies from the Psalms and Isaiah made to the Jewish people had been fulfilled. Paul said, "Through Jesus, the forgiveness of sin is being told to you. Everyone who believes is justified (declared right with God) and forgiven through Jesus because you cannot be justified through the law of Moses."

The Jewish people asked Barnabas and Paul to come again the next Sabbath and speak to them again. Some of the people followed Paul and Barnabas to ask them more questions. The next week, most of the town gathered to hear Paul and Barnabas, but the Jews started to insult Paul. Paul and Barnabas explained that they were called to speak to the Jewish people first, but because they were rejecting Jesus and eternal life, Paul and Barnabas would now tell the Gentiles. The Gentiles rejoiced and many believed in Jesus and received eternal life. God's Word spread through the region. But the Jewish people were not happy, and they created trouble for Paul and Barnabas. So, Paul and Barnabas traveled to Iconium and Lystra to tell more people about Jesus. Eventually, they traveled home to

Antioch and shared all that God had done and how the gospel was reaching the Gentiles.

### OPEN YOUR BIBLE TO THE BOOK OF ACTS

#### **READ ACTS 13:2-4**

"Paul and Barnabas were commissioned as missionaries to share the good news of Jesus. At the beginning of their journey, they traveled to the island of Cyprus, where Barnabas was from. They proclaimed the gospel there, and John Mark—Barnabas' cousin—was along on the trip assisting them."

"As Paul traveled on this journey, he proclaimed the good news that through Jesus, we can be forgiven of our sin, and by believing in Him, we can be justified.

Justified or Justification means 'to be declared righteous by God.' When you trust in Jesus as Savior, God sees Jesus' sinless life and His sacrifice on the cross for your sin when He looks at you instead of your sin."
